- 3. Discuss the difference between a generational curse and the consequences of sin. How have you seen this play out in your own life or in the lives of others?
- 4. The sermon uses the analogy of "building bridges or digging ditches" for future generations. What kind of legacy are you leaving for those who come after you?
- 5. How does the contrast between God's love to "thousands of generations" and punishment to "the third and fourth generation" impact your understanding of God's nature?
- 6. In what ways does God's desire for people to turn from sin and live reflect His compassionate and gracious character?
